Please take note of the following:

- If the applicant holds a Master's degree (or equivalent) in a discipline other than the requested doctoral discipline, the managing director is asked to compile a curriculum of doctoral studies encompassing a total of 36 CP. This requirement can be reduced through the recognition of as yet acquired credits and exams. The module handbook of the pertaining subject serves as the basis for the recognition of credits and exams. (Decision of the doctoral board of 28 January 2016).
- If the managing director is acting as the first advisor, this certification must also be signed by a colleague at the institute or department who is entitled to confer doctorates.
- The Doctoral Regulations of June 11, 2015, for admission to doctoral studies require that the candidate has attained an average grade of least 2.4 (according to the German grading system) in their preceding degree.
